To support the obvious fact that these are people's homes and contain their papers and property, I submit California Vehicle Code § 22650(b) which states: Any removal of a vehicle is a seizure under the Fourth Amendment of the Constitution of the United States and Section 13 of Article 1 of the California Constitution and shall be reasonable and subject to the limits set forth in the Fourth Amendment jurisprudence without a warrant.

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
