6 I submit Exhibit A as the compilation of official statements by City officials and
7 present only one sentence from the Dec 6, 2024 article from the San Francisco Chronicle
8 which came out the day after the announcement of the cessation of “safe parking” on
9 March 3, 2025. The quote is from the executive Director of the Department of
10 Homelessness and Supportive Housing, Shireen McSpadden, who “said that her
11 department was going to ‘regroup’ and try to determine what role safe parking sites
12 would have in the city’s homelessness intervention system moving forward.”

15 of an SFPD officer who told me that the mayor had been down here for a meeting and
16 wanted the RVs “cleared”. Exhibit C is yesterday, April 14, 2025 video

18 am a list to be towed. Exhibit D is transcript, also yesterday, from David Nakanishi who
19 is the manager of the Healthy Streets Operation Center. His video is at
20 <https://youtu.be/oLVJpAwggDI> and he clearly states he was present at said meeting with
21 the mayor, here on this street, we definitely are to be “cleared” and showed me a list on
22 paper that indicated the RVs to be towed throughout the City due to staying over the 72-
23 hour time limit.

25 To support the obvious fact that these are people’s homes and contain their papers and
26 property, I submit California Vehicle Code § 22650(b) which states: Any removal of a
27 vehicle is a seizure under the Fourth Amendment of the Constitution of the United States
28 and Section 13 of Article 1 of the California Constitution and shall be reasonable and
subject to the limits set forth in the Fourth Amendment jurisprudence without a warrant.
